Materials

Yarn

1 Ball • Madelinetosh • Tosh Vintage • 187 m/62 gm • Alizar (Maroon)

Equipment

Mittingboard™ 'Rotating' Double Knit Loom • Loom hook • Yarn needle • 3-5 mm Crochet hook


Sizing

- 1. Child
 - a. Medium: Knit a 6-inch hat using a 52 peg Knittingboard Double Rotating Loom.
 - b. Large: Knit a 7-inch hat using a 52 peg Knittingboard Double Rotating Loom.
- 2. Adult
 - a. Small: Knit an 8-inch hat using a 52 peg Knittingboard Double Rotating Loom.
 - b. Medium: Knit a 9-inch hat using a 52 peg Knittingboard Double Rotating Loom.
 - c. Large: Knit a 8-inch hat using a 60 peg Knittingboard Double Rotating Loom.
 - d. Extra-large: Adult size (M): Knit a 9-inch hat using a 60 peg Knittingboard Double Rotating Loom.

Casting-on


Figure 1: One rotation of the single rib stitch.

1. Weave one rotation of the single rib stitch (illustrated in Figure 1).

Body


Figure 2. Raised rib stitch[©] alternating between pairs and triple raised rib stitches.

1. Knit 6 to 9 inches of the raised rib stitch[©] (illustrated in Figure 2).

Crown


- 1. On both rakes, remove the left most stitch from each rib triplet (e.g. loops #2, 7, 12 on the front rake) one peg to the right and knit-off. Repeat the process on the back rake. The resulting pattern should look like the looping diagram in Figure 3.
- 2. Knit three rows of the looping pattern in Figure 3.

- 3. On both rakes, remove the right most stitch from each original triplet (e.g. loops # 4, 9, 14 on the front rake) one peg to the left and knit-off. Repeat the process on the back rake. The resulting pattern should look like the looping diagram in Figure 4.
- 4. Knit three rows of the looping pattern in Figure 4.

- 5. Cut-off a 30-inch yarn tail. Weave the yarn tail through the loops, as illustrated in Figure 5, and remove the loops from the loom.
- 6. Pull the drawstring tightly. Knot the yarn tail; hide a couple of inches within the stitches; and cut-off the rest of the yarn tail.

7. Add a crochet bind-off around the rim.
